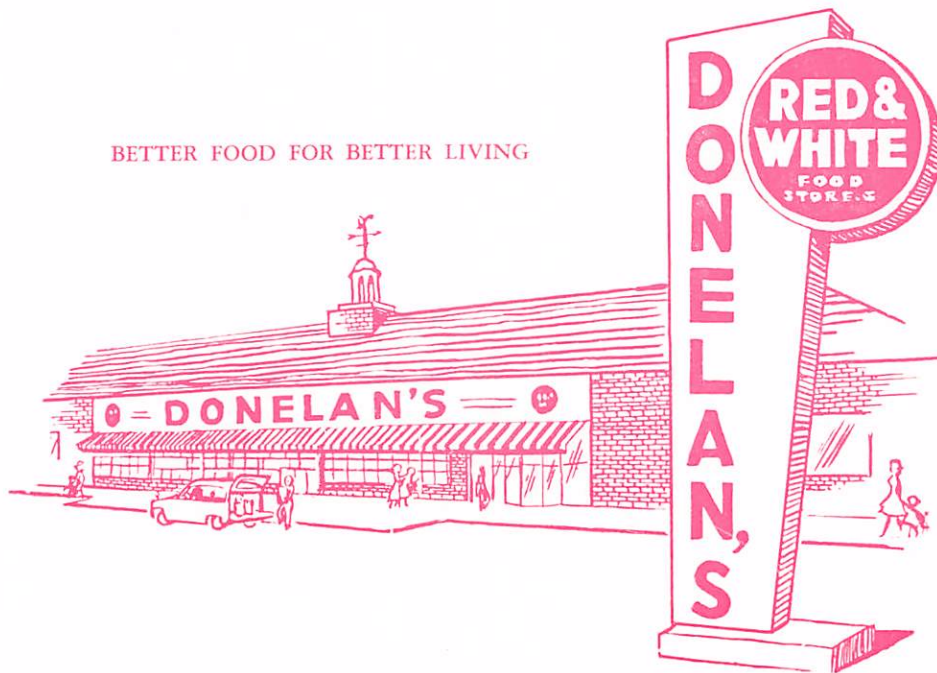

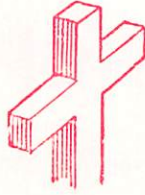

If only the innkeeper of Bethlehem had known that the King was coming he would never have been so curt or abrupt in his remarks; he would never have said: "There is no room in the inn!"

Shutting his door on Christ, taking his lantern and going to bed, sleeping while the angels sang and the King appeared — here is a picture startlingly true of man-kind's attitude today.

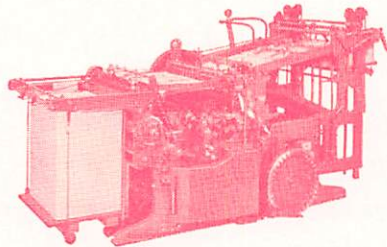

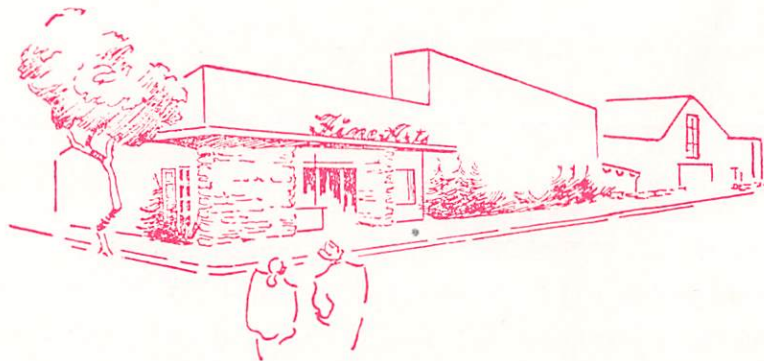

CHINESE PRAYER

The Chinese who suffer for their faith are not made of wood and stone. They are just like you, flesh and blood creatures subject to anxiety, disgust, fatigue, but above all fear — the same fear which our Saviour experienced in the Garden of Olives. It surges in them at the sound of the sirens, at the sight of the sinister automobiles prowling the streets in search of prey, at the knock of the Chinese gestapo on their door; when they are torn from the arms of their loved ones, when they are denounced as traitors in front of the public assemblies. But there is not one who does not relate after the horror has miraculously ended: "I was afraid, but I prayed."

And this is the prayer which all the Catholics in China recite every day to prepare themselves for battle:

*My God, I fear only my fear.
It could make me abandon you.
My God, I fear only my fear.
It could make me lose my courage before the end.
My God, I implore You,
Do not forget me in Your glory.
Give me Your love and the strength to give my life for You. Amen.*

Mission

EVERYTHING STARTS WITH GOOD PARENTS

Some things PARENTS must know

1. YOU HAVE AUTHORITY OVER YOUR CHILDREN.

- a. God, through you as parents, gave life to your children. Likewise He gave you the *obligation and the right* to direct your children toward a useful and happy life on earth and thereby toward their eternal destiny.
- b. How should you use this authority? Not by setting up arbitrary rules that are based on whims, feelings, or pet notions—but by applying God's laws to the lives and conduct of your children.
- c. This *means* that you must teach your children what is right in their relationship to:
 - (1) GOD: by teaching them to obey all God's laws and to grow spiritually.
 - (2) THEIR FAMILY: by helping them to develop a sense of belonging to the family unit and sharing in the responsibilities of the home.
 - (3) THEIR COUNTRY: by training them to be good citizens.
 - (4) THEIR FELLOWMEN: by teaching them to practice justice and charity toward all, beginning with their own family.

You cannot be constantly quarreling with your spouse if you want to keep your children from quarreling among themselves.

You cannot expect your children to fulfill their religious duties if you yourself fail to do so.

4. *You must look upon each child as an individual*, and consider the age, sex and temperament.

You cannot command a child of 15 as you would a child of 7.

You cannot make boys out of girls, or girls out of boys.

You cannot treat all your children in exactly the same way.

A moody and shy child needs your encouragement and help to acquire self-confidence.

An over-active, fun-loving child needs frequent correction and discipline.

A domineering child needs lessons in humility.

An easy-going child needs frequent prods to take life seriously.

You must make them realize that privileges of adults are different from teen-age privileges, just as teen-age privileges are different from those of younger children.

2. *You must show your Love* for your children, besides commanding and correcting them. Not by taking it for granted that they will love you just because you brought them into the world, fed them, clothed them, housed them. But by showing a deep interest in them—in their work, their play, their problems, their plans, their prayers; by giving them your time and companionship; by making sacrifices for them over and above providing for their material needs.

3. *Your Example to your children* is more important than your words.

You cannot use profanity yourself if you expect them not to do so.

5. *You must help your children understand that they must do what is right*, even though they see many parents and children who do not follow the rules of right living. You must teach them that each person is responsible to God for his conduct, regardless of the conduct of others.

6. *You must remember that two parents*, not one, were intended by God to direct and guide children's lives. You may not say, as a father, that you leave all training of your children to their mother. You may not say, as a mother, that you leave all commanding, correcting and punishing of your children to their father. As a father and mother, you need to work out a plan together, and to combine your efforts to put it into effect.

1. TEEN AGERS AND DATING.

PRINCIPLES:

Steady company-keeping is the normal preparation for marriage. By its very nature, steady dating leads to strong physical and psychological attraction, and to ever-increasing desires for the complete physical union which is lawful only in marriage. It follows, therefore, that steady dating is morally justified only when there is a possibility of a prudent marriage in the reasonable future.

By "steady dating" is understood:

1. Frequent (once-a-week or oftener) and exclusive dating of the same boy and girl.
2. Promises to each other that they will date no one else.
3. Acceptance on the part of their friends that they are to be dated by no one else.

Tragic consequences to which steady dating can and often does lead are:

1. *Intimacies*, forbidden outside of marriage, to which the growing physical attraction easily leads.
2. *Premature and immature marriages* due to the unwillingness of the persons to wait until a prudent marriage is possible.

In view of this, steady dating may not be taken up simply as a form of recreation and amusement.

Parents have the obligation to provide adequate education in matters of sex, especially in its purpose and morality, and to promote wholesome opportunities for group activities among young teen agers, in order to remove, as far as possible, the above-named dangers.

CONCLUSIONS:

1. Steady dating limits choice of friends, and is morally dangerous.
2. Steady dating will not be permitted to high school students, with the possible exception of Seniors. In the case of Seniors, steady dating will be permitted by parents only when they and the teen agers are willing to think of marriage as possible and prudent within a short time after high school graduation.
3. Single dates are discouraged for Freshmen and Sophomores. Group activities are recommended for all, even Juniors and Seniors.
4. Young people should be instructed at an early age that steady dating is related to a possible and prudent marriage. Moreover, they should not be thrust into activities that promote steady dating before it is proper.
