

Gary Finerty received the "Digital Counterpart of the Year" award at the second annual President's Night of the Digital Equipment Computer Users Society (DECUS). Digital Travel Services offering advance seat assignments, boarding passes

Employees who travel on company business for Digital can save time by taking advantage of advance airline seat assignments and boarding passes offered through Digital Travel Services.

When travelers book their flights, they can request either smoking or non-smoking sections of the aircraft. If a particular seating request is not available when the reservation is booked, the reservationist will book the next best seating. Upon arriving at the airport, travelers should ask if their first seating choice has become available. Airlines may close out seating at any time and assign seats when passengers check in at the airport. To ensure best seat selection, travelers should check in early -- 30 to 45 minutes prior to departure for domestic flights, and at least two hours prior to departure for international flights.

Advance boarding passes are also available through Travel Services. Airlines issue boarding passes 21 to 30 days prior to departure, except on certain economy flights.

Technical architecture introduced at fall IDECUS

Digital Information Systems (DIS) demonstrated a new Technical Architecture (TA) at the IDECUS symposium held recently in Boxboro. The TA helps to combine Digital's products with state-of-the-art techniques to satisfy business needs. Some specific goals of the TA are to replace paper with online access to data, provide system security at all levels, and make full use of clusters and distributed systems. The TA also enables users to serve customers faster and better, through improved management of data and information.

The "Digital Boxboro" exhibit demonstrated a complete facility where all the components of the TA worked together to provide a better computing environment for Information Systems. Each of the booths in Digital Boxboro represented a sample office that could be located at any Digital facility. For example, the "Internal Equipment Group" booth let customers check the status of their orders. "End-User Services" increased awareness of the products, tools, and services available to users at a facility. "Site I.S." showed the operations and system management aspects of the TA computing environment.

As part of implementing the TA with remote data servers, the exhibit was added to the Virginia Road (DIS headquarters) local area network by a long-distance bridging product called VITALINK. This allowed the exhibit to be wired up to Digital's EASYNET.

Relocation Services group created

Employee relocation services have been consolidated into a new Relocation Services group within Administration. The group provides centralized services to guide employees and their managers through the relocation process.

Says Kevin Thurston, Corporate Relocation Services manager, "We handle about 2,000 domestic moves a year, that is, people who are moving from one part of the country to another. In addition, we move the household goods of employees who are relocating internationally. We also have a transferee counseling service, which helps employees through selling their present home, finding a new home, and all the other steps in the moving process. Most importantly, though, we're a resource for relocation planning. We recommend that managers and employees contact us early on, so that their move will be as smooth as possible."

Digital contracts with about a dozen vendors, whose services range from moving and storage to insuring the move itself. "We work hard to ensure that employees receive quality service, so we want to know about any problems that may arise," Kevin says.

"Our busiest time is in the summer," he continues. "The activity starts to pick up in the early spring, and it peaks in June, July, and August."

While Corporate Relocation Services resolve many problems related to moving, employees themselves can do a lot to ensure a trouble-free move, says Kevin. "Ask questions. Understand everything up front, so that little headaches don't turn into big problems.

"Relocating is a very personal, very sensitive process," Kevin concludes. "But it doesn't have to be painful." ■

Digital sues DSI Computer Services, Inc. for copyright infringement

Digital has filed suit in U.S. District Court for the District of Maryland against DSI Computer Services, Inc., of Lanham, Md., alleging copyright infringement of Digital's VAX System Diagnostic Software. The suit seeks preliminary and permanent injunctions against DSI Computer Services, Inc., to bar DSI from infringing Digital's copyrights in its VAX diagnostic software at customer locations. The suit also seeks damages and alleges that DSI's use of VAX diagnostic software constitutes willful copyright infringement.

This action taken by Digital demonstrates the company's longstanding policy and commitment to protect vigorously its innovations resulting from investments in research and development. Digital will continue to pursue intellectual property violations on a worldwide basis, as it has in pending suits involving Emulex Corp., EMC Corp., C. Itoh, and System Industries.



Coping with holiday stress, depression

(Prepared by the Greater Maynard Area Employee Assistance Program)

Depression is a common problem that affects everyone at one time or another. It is so widespread that it is thought to be the "common cold" of the psyche. In its most severe forms, depression can lead to a state in which all motivation to do or to care about things is gone.

During the holiday period, depression can be more evident than at other times of the year. Though the holidays can be exciting and joyous, they also bring extra pressures at work and at home. These extra pressures can include extra partying, more eating and drinking, less rest and less free time. These factors can contribute to unhealthy stress and depression. Common symptoms of depression include sleep disturbances, appetite loss or excessive eating, fatigue, anxiety, and inability to concentrate. People who are depressed often feel the "4 D's:" defeated, defective, deserted, and deprived.

In addition, many people find that the holiday season brings anything but happiness. For them, the holidays highlight separation or divorce, death of a loved one, financial problems, work pressures, and being alone or away from home and family. Feeling alone and helpless often keeps depressed people from seeking the help they need. But depression is treatable. Learning what causes the "4 D's" is just one step toward gaining control over depression. There are ways to develop safe and effective strategies to cope with depression.

During the holidays, the following tips may



be helpful:

- Develop a holiday priority list. Set realistic limits and stick to them.
- 2. Think back to previous holiday times. Is there a pattern that you can anticipate and plan for?
- 3. Don't set yourself up. Don't make promises you can't keep. Be especially careful of the "I should" syndrome.
- 4. If you anticipate being alone for the holidays, try to make plans for the rough times. Think through the alternatives. Don't try to be brave.
- 5. Don't overindulge to compensate.

 Overeating, drinking too much, and partying may seem to bring temporary relief, but also emphasize depressed feelings the next day.
- Seek help. Remember, feeling helpless and hopeless clouds your ability to think the situation through. It can make you your own worst enemy.
