BEAT No. 1

Beat includes lower Main Street, starting with Church's Drug Store, Summer Street from Waltham to Nason, and Nason Street. In case of fire the officer on Beat No. 1 continues on his beat as usual.

BEAT No. 2

Beat includes upper Main Street starting with the Smoke Shop, Florida Court and Summer St. from Florida Court to Nason Street. In case of fire officer on Beat 2 goes to the fire.

Doors should be tried at 11, 1 and 3 o'clock.

In case of unavoidable delay when the officer cannot ring in a box on the scheduled time, he must make a report of the matter. When the obstacle is removed he proceeds on his beat according to the schedule. Example: __Officer King rings in at the center at 1.35 according to schedule, and going down Main Street he makes an arrest and this occupies his time until 2.10. It is then too late to ring in at Station No. 2, so he goes to Station No. 3 ringing in at 2.25 according to schedule.

NOTICE

Officers must not ride their beat in any way.

Officers must make out their reports of their night's duty, and leave in the Lockup each morning.

The officer that is off the first half of his beat must report for duty at 11.55 at Station 1.
