Richard Lary and John Shebell have been named Corporate Consulting Engineers.

Richie has been part of Grant Saviers' Storage and Information Management Group for several years. Currently, he reports to Bob Rennick, Senior Engineering manager for Subsystems in Colorado Springs, and to Mike Riggle, Senior Corporate Consultant. He is a member of the Storage Systems Strategy Task Force, and has made many innovative contributions to the design and improvement of storage subsystems and database systems.

Richie is the author or co-author of 11 patents, the most for a single person in Digital. Four of them are on the VAX system architecture alone. He has been ar-

chitect and designer for key portions of many important Digital products, including operating systems for the PDP-8 and PDP-11 minicomputers; storage interface protocols and standards such as SDI, DS, DF, and UQSSP; the Digital Storage Architecture (DSA); the UDA, KDA, and KDB disc controllers; the HSC cluster storage controller; and the VAXcluster computer interconnect.

Richie joined Digital in 1969. He is a graduate of Polytechnic University, New York City (formerly Polytechnic Institute of Brooklyn).

John has been associated with Field Service for all of his 17 years with Digital, the last nine years as manager of the

Ken Olsen wins AM Award

Ken Olsen, founder and president, has won "American Machinist" magazine's 24th annual AM Award

The award recognizes Ken's "vision of interactive computing and helping to bring the computer to manufacturing's shop floor." Accessible computers have been at the heart of computer-integrated manufacturing, which has virtually revolutionized the production of durable goods.

Digital products such as the PDP-8, the world's first minicomputer, made it practical to coordinate several numerically controlled machine tools and other pieces of production equipment into manufacturing cells.

The AM Award has been presented to prominent people in the manufacturing industries, such as robotics pioneer Joseph F. Engelberger; Charles H. Patterson, executive vice president of Ford Motor Co.; Alonzo Decker, Jr., president of Black & Decker; and Donald Burnham, president of Westinghouse Electric. "American Machinist" circulates monthly to 80,000 managers and engineers in the durable-goods producing industries.

Running Club wins second place at Corporate Marathon Championships

Digital placed second at the United State Corporate Athletic Association (USCAA) Marathon Championships held recently in Houston. Ten members of the Digital Running Club competed in the championships, which were held in conjunction with the Houston-Tenneco Marathon. Thirty-three corporate teams from around the United States competed.

Scoring was computed by using the team's top four finishers, based on their placing in age group categories. Digital scorers were: Roger Nasatka (WMO), who won the male 35-39 age group category; Terry Sutton (BXC), second place in the women's open category; Rini Schalke (OGO), second in the women's 40 and over category; and John Devlin (MLO), third in the men's open category. The second-place finish marked Digital's best finish ever at the U.S. Corporate Marathon Championships.

Other employees who participated were Terry Quan, Bill Schmidt, and Andrew Bartczak, who all work in Boxboro; Dick Joseph of the DAS facility, Andover; John Singleton, Marlboro; and Phil Gardella, who works in the Acton (AKO) facility. It was the first marathon for Rini, Terry, and Phil.

Digital's Running Club regularly competes in USCAA championships in track and marathoning, as well as competing in regional championships in track and cross-country.

New vendor named for home delivery of prescription drugs

Digital has named Express Pharmacy Services (EPS) as the new prescription drug home delivery vendor, replacing Health Care Services (HCS) effective April 1. EPS is a service of the Thrift Drug Co., a division of JCPenney. This change only applies to mail-order prescription drug purchases.

This program is designed for those who use eligible prescription drugs regularly in the treatment of a chronic medical condition. The program allows you to purchase by mail, for home delivery, a 90-day supply for \$2 per prescription.

Because of EPS' affiliation with JCPenney, you will have the option of setting up a charge account with EPS, which will bill you monthly for home deliveries. You also can choose to pay for prescription drugs as you order them. EPS order forms will be available at local Personnel offices prior to April 1.

If you or one of your dependents now uses HCS, continue to do so until April 1. You will receive more detailed information about EPS in the spring.

This change was announced to employees together with a number of other medical plan changes. If you have any questions about your medical choices, please see your Personnel representative.

Digital chosen for multimillion-dollar project

Boeing Commercial Airplanes and Boeing Computer Services, divisions of the Boeing Co., have awarded Digital a major multimillion dollar contract to provide a data management and control system for Boeing's new sheet metal manufacturing facility under construction in Auburn,

The project is the largest computer-integrated manufacturing (CIM) undertaking in Bocing history.

As prime contractor, Digital will support the new \$235 million Boeing Commercial Airplanes sheet metal center by providing the following major components: program management, networked computer systems, integration management and ongoing service and support.

Integration on the project will extend from the production floor with VAXstation 3200 workstations monitoring production to VAX 6300 computers performing area control and large VAXclusters providing overall control. Systems will be networked via DECnet Ethernet and linked to corporate systems at other Boeing facilities.

Mark performed in a similar capacity on the LANbridge 100 project. He was responsible for hardware and software architecture for the A/D prototype. He also designed most of the hardware and supervised the design of the memory system and software. The hardware design was incorporated into the LANbridge 100 product. This is still the highest performance bridge in the industry.

Mark earned a bachelor's degree from Northwestern University. The inventor of and patent holder for the learning bridge, he holds two other patents and has published several technical papers.
