George Carmichael Sr. employed to run elevator in Sec. 5, at 2:30 p.m., while cleaning underneath, car started down and rested on his shoulders, bruising and laming him some. He walked home.

Maggie Brimstin had left thumb bruised badly, cleaning loom while it was running. Caught in box, attended by Dr. Witnesses: Agnes Graham, Alina Graham, Pat Dolan

19 Feb 1889

Arthur Coughlan, aged 19, runs duster in tower of Sec. 8. At 9:00 a.m. today, had right arm caught while putting on a belt and twisted so as to break the forearm. He walked home with his father and was attended by Dr. Marsh. Witnesses: John Murphy, Christian Hanson, Michael Kelley, Michael Moynihan. April 6th: He broke it a second time at home today.

18 May 1889

Sam Glassup, age about 17, got his right hand caught in card between worker and cylinder while wiping down and scraped on back. Attended by Dr. Rich. Witnessed by: James Morgan, F. R. Connor. May 10, 1990: sore again and operated on by Dr. Marsh.

18 Sept 1889

George Kaler, yard teamster, when not busy was fooling with Tim Sullivan about 9:00 a.m. A case hook in the hands of Sullivan was run into Kaher's privates, the bag being pierced, he bled freely. Was attended by Dr. Rich. Walked home. Witnesses: Tim Murphy, Michael Sweeney.

30 Sept 1889

Bartley Nee, yard hand had 2 toes badly jambed by the end board of a coal car falling on them, about 4:30 p.m. Witness: M. Sweeney

21 June 1890

Christian Hanson (alias Thomas J. Hanson) aged about 23. Spinner, while picking waste from gears while in motion, had his right thumb caught and smashed and bone broken. 8:00 a.m. Attended by Dr. Marsh. Witnesses: William McCarthy, George L. Smithurst

28 June 1890

Annie McCarty, spooler, hurt while fooling with Mary E. Lynch at noon, fell against machine. Bad scalp wound. Witnesses: Emily Kimmel and Ida Midwood

28 June 1890

Eliza Priest, weaver aged about 22, cleaning loom while running, got first finger of right hand jammed in gear work (7 a.m.) Witnesses: Mag Coughlan, L. W. Clark, and Kate Crowley

19 Dec 1890

Hugh Miller, weaver in new miller, while going around the loom, carelessly placed his fingers in gears, cutting them badly. Witness: L. W. Clark

17 Jan 1891

Charles Punch, age about 26, employed on Gigs, had left thumb caught in gears of "Dorous" Gig at 11:00 a.m. and badly smashed, bone broken in two places. Attended by Dr. Marsh. Witnesses: Chris Hart, Connor Murphy, and James Barnes.

20 Aug 1891

Frances E. Allen, spooler, age 16, while talking with another girl, placed her fingers in the twister gears. 1st and 2nd right hand fingers badly cut. 3:00 p.m., Carelessness. Witnesses: Mary Murphy, Kate Reagan, and J. E. Denniston. Attended by Dr. E. F. Robinson

5 Oct 1891

John Fitton, weaver, age about 26, had left thumb caught by shuttle, taking off the nail and end of thumb. Negligence. Witness: William Morris. He went out and had it dressed by Dr. Marsh

14 Oct 1891

Patrick Joseph McCarty, age 15, 6:30 a.m. had leg caught by card belt and thrown over pulley breaking one bone in right leg near the ankle. Carelessness. Witnesses: James Riley, W. H. Sculley, Pat King. 19 Sett room. Taken home by George Flood and attended by Dr. Marsh (notified)

25 Nov 1896

Mary Waldron, age 22, weaver, 8:00 a.m. Was cleaning loom in new mill, removed the guard box and was caught by bal wheel. Her clothing torn, head cut, and right side injured. 11 Feb 1897

Barzilla Malcolm, about 65, elevator man in Sec. 7 for 4 years. At 8:45 a.m. was sweeping the bottom of the well. Had swept across 1 side when the car which he had sent up to spinning room came down on him. He was caught across the edge of floor. Small bruise on left hip near groin, after recovering from fright, he walked home. Went out to Dr. Marsh. Witnesses: Peter Haley, John Gallagher, Connor Murphy, W. S. Peters

2 March 1897

John Roper, age 17, weaver. At 3:00 p.m. got right index finger caught in Ed Doherty's loom. Jack motion and pinched so Dr. Marsh took off at 1st joint. Witnesses: Fred Whitehead, Edward Doherty, L. M. Clark

8 March 1897

Edward Murphy, age 50, yard man. At 9:00 a.m., fell from plank run from car to #17. Struck on frozen ground on head and shoulders. He adjusted the plank himself before stepping on it. We put on alcohol, he then went out to Dr. Flagg. Witnesses: R. W. Parmenter, Connor Manning, Fred Johnson, Emil Anderson (not notified)

8 March 1897

Warren Martin, Box shop, while working at circular saw, cut the end of little finger off, or nearly so.

John Gallagher, age 30. Ran fulling mill in Sec. 5. About 7:20 a.m. reached for oil can. His jumper caught on splined end of fulling mill roll shaft. He was lifted from floor and twisted around. Mill stopped by James Cleary and he was then released. Taken home in Sheehan's depot carriage and doctor sent for. Was strained and lamed. Witnesses: James Cleary, Michael Leonard, James Dugan, E. W. Cook

18 May 1898

Arthur Gaskill, age 18, works on Kohlrausch washer. At about 7:10 a.m. the cloth slacked and he reached over the bar without stopping machine, to take up the slack. His right hand caught between the rolls and but for John McCarty Jr. stopping machine, his arm would have been drawn in. Fingers crushed. Dr. Marsh sent for. He walked out with Dr. and went home. Witnesses: John McCarty Jr. P. F. Hanlon, Peter Hanson, William Stuart, George Weaving – said "had been told 100 times not to put his hand there". See our letter 25 June. See our letter 15 July. Paid Dr. Marsh \$20.00 + Paid Gaskill \$125.00 in settlement of time and lawyers bill in full = \$145.00. Reimbursed by Ins. Co. 28 July 98

13 June 1898

Emil Anderson, age 24, yard man. Was holding drill and was struck on thumb of right hand by John Silva. Thumb bruised and split in flesh between thumb and first finger (same hand had been injured before). Went to Dr. Flagg. Witnesses: Louis Jacobson, R. W. Parmenter. (working on L. M.'s farm)

1 Sept 1898

Clara Singleton, age 19, weaver. 1:30 p.m. reached for wash rag looking elsewhere. Her sleeve caught in gears at end of loom drawing in her right forearm. Badly lacerated. Loom stopped by Whittaker Whitehead. Ralph Whitehead had previously told her not to put her wash pail in that location. She walked home with her father. Other witnesses: Nellie Punch, Ida Garlick

5 Dec 1898

Benjamin Roberts, age 20, spinner. Wiping down with cloth, it caught and drew fingers into roller driving gears. 2nd right finger scraped quite badly. 5:00 p.m. Witnesses: Henry Ledgard, George Smithurst. (not notified)

8 Dec 1898

John Simon, age 25, Finn. 9:00 a.m. was marking a boiling kettle. Water boiled over and scalded his neck quite badly. He went out to have a Dr. dress it. Herman Weikman was working with him. Witness: Robert Crossley. (He came to office the 9th for his pay.) (notified)

19 Jan 1899

John E. Tucker, age 25, picker room, was feeding mixing picker some wool, caught in gears and he tried to take it out without stopping picker. Left little finger caught in gears that drive feed apron, and broken so the Dr. Rich amputated it at 2nd joint. He went out and saw Dr. Rich. Witnesses: James Mallinson, George Whalen 1:20 p.m. (notified)

16 Feb 1899

Charles Hoyle, age 38, loom fixer, 5:00 p.m. was up on loom and slipped off severely wrenching his right knee. Dr. Flagg called and took him home. Witnesses: William S. Smith, Joseph Rollinson, Michael Gangham (notified)

20 Feb 1899

Walter E. Tilton, age 49, carpenter 4:45 p.m. Had floor up in dye house to put in a new tub. Getting ready to lower it when he fell into the hole, struck on his right side, dislocating right shoulder. Brought to office. Dr. Goodenow called and set it and took him home. Witnesses: Samuel Lawton, Sam Lawrence, Paul Wilson (notified)

24 Feb 1899

Abraham Kanless, age 30, Finn, single, speaks some English, yard man. While handling boiler, was pulling on chain falls with R. Parmenter. Chain broke and falls fell on left foot badly cutting and bruising toes. Walked home. No Doctor. Came to work again March 1st. (not notified)

31 July 1899

John Davis, age 28, pattern weaver, was putting on the loom belt. 2nd right finger caught between belt and pulley. First joint broken and nail torn. Went to Dr. Goodenow, had it dressed, and came back to work at once. Witnesses: Albert A. Davis, David Sharp, John Brayden. (notified)

11 Aug 1899

Fred. Johnson, age 28, yard laborer, married. Was assisting in lowering gasometer, standing on brick projection. Chain falls broken, it canted over and squeezed him between it and wall. Bowels badly squeezed, no bones broken. Taken home in carriage. Dr. Goodnow took charge of him. Witnesses: Paul Wilson, Charles Sanderson, Chris Wilson, Henry Axford, R. W. Parmenter. Paid him wages \$17.06, Paid Dr. bill \$10.00, Paid druggist bill \$3.10. Reimbursed by Ins. Co. 9/22/99 (notified)

5 Sept 1899

Henry Axford, 3:00 p.m. Helper in shop, was up in the elevator tower Sec. 3. When through work, he got on the elevator to come down, put his hand on one of the landings and the door came down on his left 2nd finger, taking the nail off. He done it up and worked till bell time, went to Dr. in evening. Witnesses: Joseph Martin, Charles Sanderson

17 Nov 1899

James Lowmasney, age 50, 10:30 a.m., was sweeping #26 attic stairs. Slipped and fell, spraining ankle. Worked till Sat. noon then stayed out. Witness: Robert Brennan (notified)

1 Dec 1899

Johanna O'Brien, age 24, weaver in bottom room. At 9:45 a.m. was standing at end of loom with left hand against the wall. Shuttle flew out and hit the hand. Bad cut and bruise. Her brother was learning and he may not have put the shuttle in right, so she said. Dressed in office by Dr. Flagg. He took 3 stitches. She went home later. Witnesses: Edward Titley, R. Whitehead, Lena Hehola, Mary Fletcher, Nelson girl. Bill of \$1.00 paid by Ins. Co. (notified)

1 Dec 1899

John Vetocage, age 27, yard man, married, 11:45 a.m. Was pulling stones out of race way trench with chain falls. Took hold of loose instead of tight chain. Right middle finger drawn into block and badly lacerated. He was sent to Dr. Flagg. Witnesses: R. W. Parmenter, John King, John Smith (notified)

16 Dec 1899

Alex Veitch, at 10:00 a.m. was lifting some caustic potash on a shovel. Small piece flew into left eye. Worked till noon. Had Dr. Flagg next day. (notified)

13 Jan 1900

George W. Morris, age 14, card room (Morgans) 10:00 a.m. Was trying to take piece of waste out of doffer gears on 2nd Breakin. 2 fingers of left hand caught and badly lacerated. Went to Dr. Flagg and had them dressed. Witnesses: Robert O'Neil, Fred. Kelley, James J. Morgan. (notified 18th)

19 Jan1900

Thomas Waldron, age 16, 10:00 a.m. Bobbin boy took box bobbins to spin room. Was with John Carver and David Lemoine, emptying it into a bin. Stuck right foot out behind him and it was caught between carriage and frame of Lemoine's mule. Badly bruised below ankle. His sister went home and sent team for him.

5 March 1900

Robert Brennan, age 44, waste supervisor 3:00 p.m. Was cleaning Garnet machine with Jona Bowers. Put worker wrong way in frame and when stick was applied, it jumped out of bearings and in attempting

to save it, his right hand was caught and flesh on back torn. Dr. Flagg sent for and dressed it in office. Witnesses: Jona Bowers, Alex Veitch. (notified)

8 March 1900

James Greenhalgh, age 46. Runs a picker. At 8:40 a.m. attempted to remove wool from clogged picker while it was running. Left fingers caught and were torn by brush (1st finger broken). He came to the office. Dr. Goodenow was called. He took him home and dressed them. Amputated pc of first finger. Witnesses: Hans Neilson, James Mallinson, Alex Veitch

20 March 1900

William J. Banks, age 14. Employed to bag waste in waste house at 8:00 a.m. Attempted to pick some waste from outlet of conehuster. The teeth caught his 2nd right hand finger and broke it so it had to be amputated at 2nd joint by Dr. Flagg. His father took him to the Dr.'s office. Witnesses: Neils Olsen, A. Veitch. (notified)

2 April 1900

Mary Weik, age 40, card feeder. While picking waste from feed roll, had left thumb caught and badly torn. Was sent out to see a Dr. She wanted to come to work next morning but Connor did not think it best. Witness: James J. Morgan. (notified)

5 April 1900

John F. Mahoney, age 60, weaver on Crompton Loom (Marsden's room), 4:30 p.m. Struck by shuttle on back of right hand. Went out. Witnesses: Thomas Phillips, R. Whitehead (notified)

17 May 1900

Charles Sanderson, age 47, piper. Was in Dye House removing wooden plug from end of steam pipe. Valve had leaked steam sufficient when touched to force plug out with great force. Struck him in stomach. Dr. Flagg called and took him home. 11:00 a.m. Witnesses: William Barnes, Charles Hutchinson, R. W. Parmenter

2 June 1900

Abraham Kanless, age 27, Finn, married, works in yard, 5 p.m. Was chopping a stump in trench. His left hand struck a piece of glass in side of bank. Bad cut on back of hand. Witnesses: Oscar Neemi, R. W. Parmenter.

10 Oct 1900

Kate McCarty, age 17, spooler, at 10:45 a.m. Was fooling with gears on twister run by Nellie King. Her left hand fingers were caught in gears and the 2nd badly cut and torn, 2 others cut some. She went home. Witnesses: Nellie King, Nellie Mann, John E. Denniston

7 Dec 1900

Henry Axford, age 53, helper on piping. Was working on a ladder in the Dye house at 10:00 a.m. putting in some overhead piping. The ladder slipped and he was thrown to the floor 10 or 12 ft. His right elbow broken, right leg and side bruised. Charles Sanderson was working with him but could not see him for steam. He was assisted to the shop and James Coughlin sent for to take him home. Attended there by Dr. Flagg. Witnesses: Charles Sanderson, Paul Wilson (notified)

25 Dec 1900

John K. Fix, machines, about 3 p.m. While driving on coupling in 7 set card room (Sec. 7) sledge handle broke and hammer fell on foot. He walked home. Witnesses: Joseph Edward, Paul Wilson, A. F. Warren, James Carmichael. Fix was also injured Jan 10th 1900 in shop by a pc of shaft tipping over on his foot bruising big toe badly. Worked that day out, then loafed a few days. : Paul and Chris Wilson

5 Jan 1901

Fred. Johnson, yard man, age 30, at 10:00 a.m. Taking loom from car to wagon, his right thumb (in glove) caught by roll and badly bruised. He went with William Martin to Dr. Goodenow office and had it dressed. Witnesses: R. W. Parmenter, Mat J. Matson, Joseph Smith, James Thompson (notified)

25 Feb 1901

Newton Bean, carpenter, 34, about 3:30 p.m. in Box Shop. Cut fingers on right hand on circular saw, first finger badly. Went to Dr. Barker of Acton then to the hospital. Witnesses: Walter Tilton, John Hanna

5 Sept 1901

George Hoyle, 15 yrs, errand boy in Finnish room, at 10:00 a.m. He started up a doubling and winding machine which was idle. His left arm was drawn in with the cloth and broken above the elbow. Dr. F. P. Flagg called. Witnesses: Fred Hayward, David Hannon, Fred. Jones
