Court finds no fraud by Digital in 1964 patent application

The U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals has overturned a previous decision of the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office (PTO) which found that Digital had committed "fraud" in applying for a patent for its DECtape product in 1964. A 1980 U.S. District Court decision upholding the PTO decision was also overturned.

In a lengthy decision issued in Boston on June 12, 1981, the Circuit Court vindicated Digital, saying that the earlier finding of the PTO in 1978 amounted to "clear error" and lacked a "rational basis." "We (the court) are thus compelled to set aside the PTO's action."

The allegation of "fraud" had originally been brought in 1974 by Computer Operations, Inc. of Beltsville, Maryland, after being informed by Digital that a magnetic tape product marketed by COI likely infringed Digital's patent on DECtape which had been issued in 1968. COI petitioned the Court to declare Digital's DECtape patent invalid because, COI claimed, it was obtained through fraud. In an effort to resolve the dispute, Digital applied for re-issuance of the patent by the PTO, which three years later upheld the COI position.

Digital's appeal of this 1978 decision by the PTO had been denied by the District Court in 1980, setting up Digital's appeal to the Circuit Court of Appeals on which the June 12 decision was based.

The "fraud" of which Digital had been accused by the PTO was, in fact, "technical fraud". The main question was whether Digital had applied for a patent on

DECtape within one year of that product being "on sale," as required by Patent law. The Circuit Court found that no such technical fraud was shown in the case presented by the PTO. The PTO did not accuse Digital of having an actual intent to deceive.

A spokesman for Digital said the company was "obviously, very pleased with the decision of the Circuit Court of Appeals. We have taken this fraud allegation very seriously and have been confident that our vigorous efforts over the past three years to vindicate our honesty and integrity would ultimately be successful."

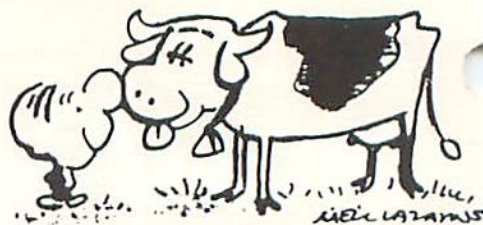

Digital joins in an old-fashioned barn raising

On November 12, a fire destroyed the barn and 100 tons of feed of the Massachusetts Audubon's Drumlin Farm. A heat lamp used to warm some ailing calves overturned and started the fire. But by morning a fund had been established to rebuild the Lincoln landmark.

Through the Matching Gifts Program, Digital employees contributed over \$2,300 to the Fire Fund. In addition, the Corporate Contributions Committee recently gave Drumlin Farm a large grant to aid in rebuilding the barn.

Though the barn's oak, mahogany, chestnut timbers and handmade nails can never be replaced, plans are to make the farm's educational center better than ever. The new barn, to be

during construction set the project back another year.

The prehistoric cultural material recovered through excavation by Harvard and Massachusetts Historical Society has shown that the Flagg Swamp Rock Shelter is one of the richest archaeological sites in inland New England. Flaked and ground stone tools and preserved bones, nuts and seeds were uncovered.

The analysis of all recovered material is presently being conducted at the Institute of Conservation Archaeology and other New England institutions.



Digital Computer Museum presents lecture on first electronic computer - ENIAC

On June 25, Digital Computer Museum will present a lecture by John G. Brainerd on the ENIAC, the first electronic computer. This is the sixth lecture in a series presented on pioneers in computer development.

Brainerd, a professor at the Moore School at the University of Pennsylvania, served as the project supervisor representing the Engineering Department on the ENIAC Project. The research, directed by J. Preper Eckert and

John Mauchly, was funded by the Ordnance Department of the Army during World War II.

The museum is open for a reception and tour following the lecture which begins at 5 p.m.

The Digital Computer Museum is dedicated to the history of computing throughout the world. It is located at One Iron Way, Marlboro (MR1). Its hours are from 9-5, Mon-Fri. Tours may be arranged by calling 617-467-4036 or DTN 231-4036.
