Internal DECUS sponsors Spring Symposium

Internal DECUS (Digital Computer Users Society) will hold its 1981 Spring Symposium for internal users of Digital's equipment at the Sheraton Conference Center in Boxborough, Mass. from April 28-30. President Ken Olsen will be the opening speaker on Tuesday morning, April 28.

The symposium is designed to promote an awareness of the methods and trends of information management highlighting theories and techniques. Symposium sessions will address how these trends could affect users and Digital's future product plans.

Representatives from the business sector and educational institutions will present a broad perspective to internal users concerning the current state of the

art. Forty sessions, workshops and panel discussions will focus on office automation, data center management, system migration issues, project life cycle, large system overview and the engineering planning process.

William Synnott, senior vice president and head of Information Systems and Services of the First National Bank of Boston, will speak on "Information Management in the 80's" on Tuesday. Howard Anderson, president of the Yankee Group, a consulting firm specializing in communications, will present "The Innovative/Technologically Receptive Company" on Wednesday, April 29. On Thursday, Dr. Robert Alloway, M.I.T., will run a four-part seminar on decision support systems.

Harvard Professor Ezra Vogel, author of "Japan As Number One," will be Friday's keynote speaker. His presentations will be "The Challenge from Japan."

Other guest speakers for the three-day symposium include Dr. Eric von Hippel and Dr. Lynn Markus of M.I.T.'s Sloan School of Management, and Richard Perkinson, a principal consultant for Q.E.D. Information Sciences, Inc.

Pre-registration is required for the IDECUS Symposium. There will be NO WALK-IN REGISTRATION as in past symposiums. The preliminary program and registration information will be available on March 20. 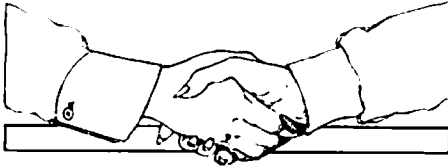
