PDP-11/45 Prototype retires

The original hand-crafted PDP-11/45 prototype was retired to the Digital Computer Museum in Marlboro after eight years of varied service in Digital.

At ceremonies on Sept. 15, Gwen Bell, director of the museum, accepted the prototype from representatives of Systems Evaluation Engineering (SEE), who were using the system.


The Engineering prototype, weakened by etch changes and circuit revisions, was slated for salvage along with tailored TU10, TU56, and RK03 vintage eripherals. But the equipment was saved and integrated as a

was saved and integrated as a system to be used by SEE to study Unibus operations.

Several Unibus trouble shooting tools designed during this phase are in use today by SEE and Field Service. Methods for stabilizing Unibus operations were also determined and implemented. The system became the most reliable and dependable in the Mill complex.

Later, under the name of System #37, it was used as a RSTS/E Time Share System and a test bed for some of Digital's newer products announced earlier this year. The system's final job was as a connection of the Engineering Network. It has been replaced by the more efficient and the greater memory capacity PDP-11/70 system.

The Digital Computer Museum is located in the lobby of MR2. Employees may tour the museum and see the PDP-11/45 prototype uring regular museum hours, 8:15-5, Monday through Friday.

DCU offers All Savers Certificates

The much publicized All Savers Certificates will be offered by Digital Credit Union (DCU) beginning October 1, according to general manager Richard D. Mangone.

The new certificates offer DCU members definite tax advantages. Savers may claim a tax exclusion of up to \$1,000 if filing singly (and \$2,000 if a joint return) on dividends earned on certificates purchased between October 1, 1981 and January 1, 1983.

The certificates have a one year maturity and a \$500 minimum deposit is necessary.

The certificates yield will be equal to the 70% of the average investment yield for the most recent auction of the 52 week U.S. Treasury Bills. That means you would earn 9.614% on the current 13.735% Treasury Bill.

Early withdrawal means that the saver will forfeit any tax exemptions. By law, the certificates cannot be used as collateral for loans.

Merit Exams set for October

Children of all full-time employees are eligible to compete in the Digital National Merit Scholarship Program. Since the program's initiation six years ago, Digital has sponsored 35 students.

To qualify, high school students must take the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) in the fall of their junior year.

National Merit has set two dates, Oct. 13 and 17, when schools may schedule the exam. Students should check with their guidance counselor to find out which date their school will use.

Household Goods Relocation is the group within Digital responsible for the shipping of household goods for relocating employees -new hires and transfers. Under Finance & Adminstration and part of Corporate Distribution in Northboro, Household Goods Relocation arranged 1,830 domestic moves and 97 international moves in the last fiscal year.

Domestic moves are arranged by Relocation through local agents representing 11 nationwide van lines. The selection of a carrier is based on cost and their past service record, documented by employee's evaluations of their performance after a move. These factors determine the percentage of business Digital will allocate to each van line. This Relocation

roup also meets with each carrier on a quarterly basis to discuss their performance.

International moves are booked by the same criteria with five international forwarders strategically located around the world.
