### Alice Warren school teacher

MAYNARD — Alice (Quinn) Warren, 89, of Powder Mill Circle, died Friday, Jan. 18, 1980 at Union Hospital in Lynn.

She was born in Lynn, the daughter of State Sen. Martin Lynn, and Lizzie (Doyle) Quinn.

She was a graduate of Salem State Teachers College, and in 1914 was the first principal of Machon School in Swampscott.

He died in 1969.

She was the director of Mt. Calvary Lutheran Kindergarten in Acton, and was a member of the Union Congregational Church of Maynard.

Surviving are a sister, Mrs. John J. (Florence) Murray, of Lynn, a niece, Mrs. Edgar (Dorothy) Wurdeman, of Lynn, and six grand nieces and nephews.
