## LEMMI STICKS

Mah - koo - ay      ko - tay - oh      Way - koo - ay      tah - nah

To make the sticks

They are usually about 9 inches long and  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch in diameter, made out of already processed wood, such as broom sticks or dowels, or from green sticks cut from trees. These sticks may be left smooth or may be painted or carved.

1. Designs and initials may be made in natural wood by the Indian method whereby decorations are cut in the bark on an unpeeled stick, which is then held over a fire until the exposed parts are charred a deep brown. The rest of the bark is then cut away so that the brown design stands out sharply against the white background of the unburned wood.
2. To paint lemmi sticks, use enamel and let dry thoroughly.

To play the game

Two players sit facing each other on the floor, each with her own set of sticks. As players advance in skill, four may play sitting in a square facing partners. The following movements are performed according to the rhythmic chant below: - -

| 5. knock, clap, throw r, pass l to r<br>knock, clap, throw l, pass r to l<br>repeat once   | 6. to the side, knock bottom, knock top<br>flip twice<br>to the front, knock bottom, knock top<br>flip twice, repeat once |
| 7. knock, clap, throw r, throw l, and continue throwing to end of verse, leaning backwards until you are on your back. (This should be by the time you reach X in the music. If you are not on your back by this time, start coming back up continuing to throw r, and then l) |   |



# LEMMI STICK PATTERNS

1.

Hit ends on floor  
Hit own sticks together  
Hit partner's right stick  
Hit ends on floor  
Hit own sticks together  
Hit partner's left stick  
repeat

2.

Hit ends on floor  
Hit own sticks together  
Hit partner's right stick  
Hit Partner's left stick  
repeat

3.

Single throw  
Hit ends on floor  
Hit own sticks together  
Throw right stick to partner  
Hit ends on floor  
Hit own sticks together  
Throw left stick to partner  
repeat

4

Double throw  
Hit ends on floor  
Hit own sticks together  
Throw right stick to partner  
Throw left stick to partner  
repeat

5.

Three Flapper  
Hit ends on floor at left side of body  
Flip both sticks  
Hit ends on floor (still on left side)  
Hit ends on floor in front of you  
Flip both sticks  
Hit ends on floor (still in front)  
Hit ends on floor at right side of body  
Flip both sticks  
Hit ends on floor (still on right side)  
Hit ends on floor in front of you  
Flip both sticks  
Hit ends on floor (still in front)  
repeat

6.

Rockaby right and left  
(hold sticks in front of you with fists close to floor)  
Hit sticks on floor  
Tilt sticks to left and touch tips to floor  
Tilt sticks to right and touch tips to floor  
Hit ends on floor  
Hit own sticks together  
Throw right stick to partner  
Throw left stick to partner  
repeat

7.

Rockaby front and back  
(hold sticks in front of you with fists close to the floor)  
Hit sticks on floor  
Tilt sticks toward partner and touch tips to floor  
Tilt sticks toward and touch tips to floor  
Hit ends on floor  
Throw right stick to partner  
Throw left stick to partner

8.

Squares to the right  
Hit ends of sticks on floor  
Hit own sticks together  
Throw right stick to partner's left hand (at the same time)  
Throw your left stick into your right hand.

*ah ha nah  
Ok! ah we! ok  
nummah nummah no  
koo so  
Si ha si  
Nah wah key ah  
nummah, nummah  
ok koo so.*
