Every number on the program was well rehearsed and the presentations were heartfelt and free as only children can be, without airs and current fads.

The program was as follows: piano introduction by Roy Helander; an opening speech (which we will print out at the end of this article) was given by the mistress of ceremonies, Irma Koivu, with art and ability, that being rare in a child of her age. Poems by Isabella Koski, Janet Klemola, Evelyn Walsh and Vivian Helander; singing by the children; poems by Bobby Ojalehto and Thelma Bourne; singing by Helmi Paakki and Irma Koivu; poems by Joe Walsh, Mildred Maki and Viola Kallio; dancing by the chidren and a poem by Roy Helander. This was followed by a two act play "Koulu Toverit" (The School Chums) by the youngsters and some of the children. The play was beautifully done, leaving a feeling among the adults that this interest among the youngsters should be developed so that they could take roles In plays, thus providing a firm group to continue the cultural work that their parents have begun. We offer our thanks to the children and the teachers on behalf of the audience and the parents for the substantial program they had arranged for Christmas evening.

Yet our future can be dark if we have not received at home the teaching that as children of the laboring class we must learn how to understand the paths of life, so that we can be prepared to work for a society that would choose total peace for all people and all nations. Only then the children of that future time can celebrate Christmas as a festival of peace. I wish you all a happy new year and thank you for having come to join us.
